Wishing you all a relaxed and enjoyable half term break.







It' was great to see the students interacting differently with staff and peers and having a chance to be mindful and improve their wellbeing through different methods.
















Knowledge is power.

Parents and Carers can also see what students are learning about too, getting involved in revising by quizzing (without having to know it all yourself). Students are expected to have these with them every day on their desk to support them with their learning too.









We continue to strive for the highest standards and expectations

In our ongoing quest to provide a high quality learning experience for all our students, we need your support in ensuring your child is accessing this through continued high levels of attendance. Whist we recognise that COVID has impacted some students attendance this academic year, we need to work together to minimise learning time lost. Please continue to ensure that:

- Your child is in school ready to access their Personal Development session at 8:30am daily
- Your child is ready for learning they have correct equipment and correct uniform
- Your child accesses non-emergency medical appointments outside of school time
- Holidays are booked outside of term time

We expect students to maintain attendance levels above 97%. If your child's attendance levels drop below 90%, you will be invited in to meet with a member of the team. If you have concerns about your child's attendance or feel we need to be made aware about a barrier affecting your child's attendance to school, please do not hesitate to make an appointment with your child's progress team to discuss this further.
