Miss Arif's aim was to bring the community, businesses, staff and students together to show the importance of their religion and to raise money for the students chosen charity, Islamic Relief.

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Home Learning at E-ACT Parkwood Academy 2022/23

Homework is incredibly important to us here at E-ACT Parkwood Academy. Homework has huge impact on students' learning by enabling pupils to undertake independent learning to practice and consolidate skills, conduct in-depth inquiry, prepare for lessons or revise for exams.

It is important in raising student achievement. An Education Endowment Foundation study shows that homework has a positive impact on average (+ 5 months), particularly with pupils in secondary schools.

To help your child to succeed, they now have Knowledge Organisers, which are folders full of the core knowledge that they need for each subject. These Knowledge organisers will support your child to complete their homework. To that end, they will need to be carried every day and so **your child will need a bag large enough to fit an A4 folder in it.** Please ensure that your child has a bag large enough to accommodate this on their return in September.

Not all homework is done at home; in fact, for some pupils who find it hard to work at home, or for some tasks which may require resources (books, software, equipment) more readily available at school, it is necessary or desirable to carry out the task at school. We have support on hand every day after school to help your child succeed. Please contact us if you or your child needs support!

Tips to support you child completing homework

- **1. Know the teachers and what they're looking for.** Attend our school events, such as parents evenings, to meet your child's teachers. Ask about their homework and how you should be involved and how you can help.
- **2. Set up a homework-friendly area.** Make sure your child has a well-lit place to complete homework. Keep supplies paper, pencils, glue, scissors within reach.
- **3. Schedule a regular study time.** Some kids work best in the afternoon, others may prefer to wait until after dinner.
- **4. Help them make a plan.** Encourage your child break up the work into manageable chunks, and ensure that they have breaks
- **5. Keep distractions to a minimum.** This means no TV, loud music, or phone calls.
- **6. Make sure kids do their own work.** They won't learn if they don't think for themselves and make their own mistakes. Parents can make suggestions and help with directions. But it's your child's job to do the learning!
- **7. Be a motivator and monitor.** Ask about assignments, quizzes, and tests. Give encouragement, check completed homework, and make yourself available for questions and concerns.
- **8. Set a good example.** Do your children ever see you diligently balancing your budget or reading a book? Children are more likely to follow their parents' examples than their advice.
- 9. Praise their work and efforts.
- **10.** If there are continuing problems with homework, get help. Talk about it with your child's teacher, encourage your child to attend Homework Club, or pop in.

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
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Attendance
