After half term pupils will be reminded about the expectations of them during lesson time so that they can ensure they get the most out of their learning.

Sit up because it shows that you are engaged

Track the speaker to show that theirs and your ideas matter

**Acknowledge others** contributions and ideas nodding and making reference to what has been said

**Respond in a full sentence** using academic vocabulary to rehearse for writing and to demonstrate knowledge

These clear expectations will be reinforced by class teachers. By ensuring that pupils pay attention to the teacher and to each other, we will maximise every minute of precious learning time to ensure pupils continue to achieve the best possible outcomes and exceed their targets.

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### **Culture Update**

At Parkwood Academy we continue to ensure that we strive for the highest of expectations from all our staff and students. Our core behaviour ethos and values centre around all staff and students being Ready, Respectful and Safe. We have taken the time to carefully codified each of our behaviour expectations for our students to ensure that they understand fully what is expected from them each day. Our behaviour ethos is regularly shared during daily Personal Development sessions, weekly assemblies and half-termly 'Reset' Assemblies to embed our expectations and routines as social norms.

It is extremely important for us as an Academy that all students and families understand and value our expectations, we feel that if our students are ready to learn, respectful towards their peers and adults and are emotionally and physically safe they will thrive within our learning community.

Moving forward we have made a few adjustments to our current policy to highlight the importance of teaching and learning once again for our students. As an Academy we appreciate that some of our students will not always get it right and we have a sanction policy in place for those students. As you are aware our current C System is;

- C1 First formal warning
- C2 Chance2Change (Restorative conversation 10-minute detention with form tutor)
- C3 Removal from lesson (Parked in a 'Buddy Room' within the Department 30-minute detention with Progress Team)
- 3 C3's in one day Reset and Ready the following day (R&R)

When our students return after half-term our updated policy will now be;

- C1 First formal warning
- C2 Chance2Change (Restorative conversation 10-minute detention with form tutor)
- **C3** Removal from lesson (Parked in a 'Buddy Room' within the Department 45-minute detention with SLT)
- 2 C3's in one day Immediate Reset and Ready for the remainder of the day, including the 45-minute C3 detention)

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### **Culture Update continued –**

Students will also receive a 30-minute detention should they;

Arrive late to the Academy after 8.30am - unauthorised reason

Inappropriate corridor behaviour — Not meeting our 'Quiet Corridors' expectations

Inappropriate social time behaviour — Not respecting other learners who are continuing to learn.

Our sanction policy for students will not accumulate throughout the day and the maximum amount of a time a student would spend in detention on any given day would be 45-minutes, meaning all students would complete detentions by 3.55pm.

If a student is placed into R&R, it will be an opportunity for them to work closely with our pastoral staff to reflect upon current behaviours, regulate before returning to learning the following day and complete a programme of education. They will continue to access work from their lessons to complete before the end of the day. Parents will be updated should a student be placed into R&R.

We are aware that these sanctions are in place for the minority of our students who make the wrong choices and for the overwhelming majority of our students who attend the Academy every day and meet our expectations we need to celebrate and recognise their achievements. Each lesson students have an opportunity to be awarded 3 Recognition Points, these help us decide which students gain access to our end of term reward events, such as trips to Alton Towers, Yorkshire Wildlife Park, Jump Inc, or events run in school, such as pizza parties or movie afternoons.

As an Academy value the power of positive verbal praise and recognise that our students want to be noticed doing the right thing. Students who go over and above in their lessons will receive a Golden Ticket from their teacher, these act as a positive postcard to home to recognise the achievement of your child during their lesson. Golden Tickets can also, at times, be exchanged for Amazon vouchers, lunchtime queue passes or access to a variety of rewards. Each week we celebrate and recognise the successes of our students through Hot Chocolate Friday's when staff nominate students from across the Academy to have a hot chocolate with the Head Teacher.

As always, thank you for your continued support of the Academy as we strive to deliver the highest quality provision and education for your child.

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### **Uniform**

It is a basic expectation that all students wear full school uniform. The academy does not permit trainers or sports shoes of any description, nor do we permit students to wear leggings. Jewellery is also not permitted to be worn in the academy. Within PE lessons students are expected to wear a Parkwood PE T-Shirt, Black shorts/tracksuit bottoms or suitable black sports leggings and a pair of suitable sports trainers which can be any colour. ### **Recognising Good Attendance at Parkwood:**

Since returning in September, we have monitored each student's attendance and you may have already received communication from the Academy if your child's attendance has dropped below our 97%. This will continue should your child's attendance continue to drop. We want to work with families to ensure all students attendance remains at a high level and we will be contacting you to offer support should it not. Attendance below 90% is classed as persistent absence, which means your child may achieve up to 2 grades below what they are capable of and also puts you at risk of prosecution from the local authority. It is important to us that we recognise and reward good attendance. This term we have rewarded students for good attendance with performance and activities in school as well as trips and visits out of the Academy. Next term, we will also be rewarding those students who have worked hard to improve their attendance. As always, thank you for your continued support.
