Be ready to learn having the correct equipment means:	 PE kit – full P.E. uniform Pen – blue, black and red pen Knowledge organiser for every lesson Pencil Ruler
Contributing to lessons – Be a STAR - means:	 Sit up straight – focus on the teacher Track the speaker (Listening and responding) Acknowledge others contributions and ideas Responding in a full sentence using academic language Making notes Be an active learner Asking for and responding to feedback

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Respectful

Follow all instructions given by staff means:	 The adults in the school are giving you an instruction to remind you of how we expect our students at Parkwood to behave They are qualified members of staff who are asking you to do something because it matters
Never interrupt or speak over a member of staff means:	 Staff will not continue to talk if pupils are not listening with no exceptions We also expect pupils to listen to each other when they are talking The teacher is the expert in the room – it is important that we listen to all direct instructions and knowledge being shared
Speak respectfully to your peers and adults in the academy means:	 Speak politely and respectfully to other students Say 'Please' and 'Thank you' Think before you speak Remain quiet if you have nothing pleasant to say Professional language used by all staff and students Working co-operatively with other students when asked to do so in lessons Speak quietly and in a polite tone of voice
We do not accept discriminatory language means:	 We challenge all discriminatory language and address immediately We do not use language that may be offensive to others We do not use language that may be considered hurtful to others Acknowledge that our school community is diverse so we think before we speak We are respectful towards those who may hold a different view point to ours
Say 'please' and 'thank you', hold doors open for others. Greet adults and each other by saying 'good morning' or 'good afternoon' means:	 We demonstrate our manners Being polite really helps to give a good impression to other people that we care about others We are a community and we look after each other

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Safe

Move around the academy in a safe way means:	 Pace and Purpose We move around the Academy quietly We do this to respect others. Other year groups are in lessons learning.
